Members of ARCA's Young Professionals and News Channel 3 Surprise Squad Give Free Roof Repair to Single Mom

Members of ARCA's Young Professionals committee enjoy giving back to the communities in Arizona.

(September 2018, Arizona) – News Channel 3 Surprise Squad received a submission from Sandra, Rachel Riff's mother, asking for assistance in repairing her daughter's roof. At the time Eric Perry, Azul Roofing Solutions, was communicating with the news station and together along with the members of ARCA's Young Professionals were able to successfully reroof Rachel's home.

Details behind Sandra's request

Rachel Riff's fiancé Luke, was hit and killed by a drunk driver on May 2, 2015, just two weeks after they found out that she was pregnant with her 2nd child. Proceeding the death of Luke, she was able to secure their home at 202 W. Villa Rita in Phoenix AZ. The house was falling apart around Rachel (24), Addison (5) and Levi (2).

Rachel works at Buddy Stubbs Harley Davidson in Phoenix but her cost for daycare is often more than her paycheck. She receives no monetary assistance from the courts because she was not yet married when Luke was killed. Her roof needed to be replaced - first rain of the monsoon season brought down drywall and required several tarps to be put on the roof. Rachel lost the love of her life in the middle of planning their wedding and is trying to provide the best she can for her two children. She was nominated for Arizona Families Surprise Squad for help by her mother, Sandra.

Upon learning about Rachel's situation Mr. Perry reached out to the members of ARCA's Young Professionals and the response was overwhelming.

Details about the Roof Repair

The Young professionals went to Buddy Stubbs wearing their YP shirts and hid in a back room while the news crew surprised her. During the surprise revelation the group appeared from the back room to meet Rachel to share the good news, a complete roof replacement valued at approximately \$12,000. Completely free to her!! She also received 2 months of free daycare from her daycare providers.

The Young Professionals scheduled the work to begin September 19, and completed it early on September 21, 2018. Rachel was in attendance the whole time and was continuously crying with excitement and appreciation.
